FINDING THE REAL LIFE OF JOY

Jesus' words are spirit and they are life. They are not laws written down in a book. St Paul wrote: (God) has given us the competence to be ministers of a new covenant, a covenant which is not of written letters, but of the Spirit; for the written letters kill, but the Spirit gives life (2 Cor 3.6). With a law we pass or fail, keep it or break it, we are either blameless or condemned.

Jesus' words are spirit and wisdom. They are not pass or fail. They are words to chew and digest. These wisdom words do not condemn us but rather give us life. They give shape and direction to our lives. The words challenge us to search our priorities. We have to question ourselves: whom do I prefer? To whom do I give my ultimate allegiance and loyalty? We cannot be god to anyone and no one can be god for us. If we let that happen the only result is slavery and domination.

We are not even to be lords of our own lives. We have to lose our own little egos, our own little fabrication of fear, favour and survival in order to find and receive the true self, which is in God. We are made for God and as St Augustine said: "Our hearts are restless until they rest in You". The soul has a capacity for God and nothing less than God can fully satisfy.

At first this word of wisdom upsets us. Jesus said: You shall know the truth and the truth will set you free. The truth will set us free but often, first of all, it makes us miserable! This is because our hearts are everywhere and anywhere except with God! We are much more self-centred than we can possibly imagine and people and things and our skills and achievements are much dearer to us than God.

God knows all this and understands all this and has great compassion and patience with us. And God wants us to have the deep incomparable joy, peace, love, ecstasy, passion and fire that only God can give. And God wants us to have joy in all peoples, creatures and things. St Paul wrote: For all things are yours the world or life or death or the present or the future – all belong to you, and you belong to Christ and Christ belongs to God. (1 Cor 3:21ff)

To receive this new, great life we must die to the little "life" which is so vulnerable, so easily upset, so dependent on others, so restless. Yet we cling on to it with the desperation of a limpet. This is why we must take up our cross and why real growth is nearly always painful.

But the fruit of this new life is a much deeper joy and a sweeter love because in our hearts everything and everyone is now in harmony with God and there is no cause for sadness. (DMA)
