Christian Gratitude

One of the very first lessons we get schooled in as children, is to be grateful for all that we received or was done for us. The word **THANK YOU** was taught, demanded, much appreciated and made to remember so many times than we still can remember or imagine. This was not only in words. Our body Posture had to accompany the words.

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us another parable for our meditation. In this parable the landowner is God, the vineyard is Israel – God's chosen people, and the tenants are the political and religious leaders of Israel. The story emphasizes the failure of the tenants, the chosen people of God and their leaders, to express **GRATITUDE** for what they had received from God. Jesus through this Parable wants to remind us that we are expected to show our gratitude to God by bearing fruits of the Kingdom, that is, the fruits of the Holy Spirit, in our lives.

Gratitude is a virtue most worthy of our cultivation. Indeed, in the life of a Christian, gratitude is to be planted, watered, nurtured, and harvested. Gratitude gets at the very essence of what it means to be created, sustained and be redeemed by God. On the contrary, Ingratitude was at the heart of the fall of our first Parents and at the heart of what's fallen about us to this day. St, Paul tells us in the Letter to the Roman that "Although they knew God, they did not honour him as God or give thanks to him" (Rm. 1:21). Gratitude is one of the most powerful human emotions that exists. The physical, mental and spiritual benefits of gratitude have been scientifically studied, and the results are both astounding and fascinating. As a matter of fact, the Bible teaches that the expression of gratitude like thanksgiving should indeed be a daily priority. For example, St. Paul begins many of his letters to the early Church by expressing thanks. Colossians 3:17 says, "And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him" and Ephesians 5:20 encourages us to "give thanks always for all things to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ."

We all have so much to be grateful for in this life each day. However the reality is that sometimes constant life struggles, demands and worries give more room to defeat than to a grateful thanks. At other times we forget, in the midst of busyness and pressures, just to pause and give thanks, for all that God has done, and continues to do in our lives.

Virtually every religion has emphasized gratitude or gratefulness as a virtue so vital to individuals and groups of persons. Besides, it is part of the ethical foundation of world religions that people are morally obligated to give thanks to their God and to each other. Sacred Scriptures, and the Sacraments inculcate tendencies of gratefulness by bringing people into a relationship with a Supreme Being and with members of their faith community. This indicates that gratitude is something profoundly basic about the human condition. When we are grateful for something we consider its origins. Where did it come from, who was responsible for it, why and for what purpose does it exist, what should I do about it.

HOW BENEFICIAL IS A HEART FULL OF GRATITUDE

- It gets our eyes off ourselves, and helps us to focus more on God.
- It reminds us we're not in control, but God is. It keeps us in a place of humility and dependency on Him, as we recognize how much we need Him.
- It helps us to recognize we have so much to be thankful for, even all of the very little things, that often we may forget to thank God or others for, which often are the biggest and most important things in our lives. It takes our attention from our problems and helps us instead to reflect on, and to remember, the goodness of God and his blessing.
- It reminds us that God is the Giver of all good gifts. A grateful heart reminds us that ultimately God is our Provider and that all blessings and gifts are graciously given to us by His hand.
- A heart of gratitude leaves no room for complaining. For it is impossible to be truly thankful and filled with negativity and ingratitude at the same time.
- It makes the evil forces run for they cannot stand to be around hearts that give thanks and honour to God. Our praise and thanksgiving will make them flee.
- It opens up the door for continued blessings. It invites God's presence and our spirits are refreshed and renewed in Him. God loves to give good gifts to His children. He delights in our expression of gratitude and pours out His Spirit and favour over those who give honour and gratitude to Him.
- Our prayers of thanksgiving add nothing to God's greatness but make us grow in his **LOVE AND GRACE.**

It is greatly believed and held true that people who are grateful often have lower blood pressure, less anxiety, better relationships, a greater willingness to help others and are more likely to see their lives as meaningful, among other benefits indicated in several studies. Instead many people are finding it difficult to be thankful in a society filled with economic uncertainty, and where greater individualism can place a higher value on competition than community.

St. Paul in his first letter to the Thessalonians says "Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."
