OUR TWINNED DIOCESE OF BAMENDA: This weekend we pray for the Diocese of Bamenda – the English-speaking part of the otherwise French-speaking republic of Cameroon, with whom we have been twinned since 1974.

There is a leaflet, "Bamenda Briefing", produced by our diocesan Bamenda Committee, which is available to you this weekend.

At present no Portsmouth diocesan priests are working in Bamenda, and the boot is now on the other foot, as several Bamenda priests are serving in parishes in our Diocese. On the other hand, we are supporting financially a large number of projects.

While the local people do their best to improve their schools and clinics, and to build churches to accommodate the increasing numbers, they just cannot manage without aid.

At present Bamenda is suffering from civil unrest caused by a sense of injustice that the central Government is neglecting the region, and Archbishop Cornelius Esua asks for our prayerful support.
