NOT HAVING MORE BUT BEING MORE

Most of us, maybe, are consumer addicts. We take for granted the ideal of having greater consumption, higher material standards of living, and ever more luxurious and expensive possessions.

The whole world economy is now virtually geared for this. It is the cultural deity which must be served and serviced at all costs. The celebration of Christmas has for many of us just become a heightened "feeding frenzy" of consumerism. The secularisation of this season is virtually complete leaving us with just a residue of lip service paid to events and narratives with which we now have only a tenuous connection. No wonder that some have called for a complete separation of the commercial from the Christian celebration.

In the meantime, we try to redeem the situation by generosity, care, compassion, reconnecting with distant friends and relations.

We try not to over indulge, without becoming killjoys. We pray for patience to welcome & live peacefully with folk who are, albeit temporarily, sharing our space, upsetting our routines, not enjoying the same TV programmes and not agreeing either with our religious or political beliefs.

Perhaps the whole experience only stimulates our desire - for deeper reflection, for more sincere and honest relationships with God and others, for a healthier body and soul, for a world no longer suffering oppression, poverty, and conflict, for a simpler, less pressured lifestyle.

Perhaps, we realise more deeply that possessions, in so far as we crave them and depend on them, can actually diminish us. If we are not careful they can disempower us. We can fail to see the beauty and power of our own, God given, being and our amazing potential for life, love and giftedness. And when our being draws on the Divine source in Christ, its potential is boundless & glorious (DMA)
