The Eucharist - the Body and Blood of Christ - is a mystery with so many layers and a depth that takes more than a lifetime to penetrate. It is not just a “thing” that we receive - however reverently - it is a person, a relationship, a belonging and a transformation that we consume, that becomes part of us: “Receive what you are - the Body of Christ”. The readings invite us to reflect on how our celebration of the Eucharist brings Christ’s words to our reality: “...who eats my flesh and drink my blood lives in me and I live in him.” The people of the Old Testament had God living in their midst, walking with them on their journey, feeding and nourishing them with the gift of manna from heaven. Jesus walks with us, not looking on from afar, journeying “in communion” with us - living within us, as we eat and drink the gifts he extends from the Last Supper. And as Saint Paul reminds us, our communion with the One Christ is also a communion with each other - God lives in us as the Church, as we become His Body.

The new General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) comes into force on the 25th May 2018 and will impact every organisation which holds or processes personal data. The diocese in conjunction with parishes and curial offices are now in the process of revising processes to ensure that we are compliant. The diocese is committed to ensuring high standards of information security, privacy and transparency.

THE MONTH OF JUNE is particularly rich in festivals of the Church. We begin this week with **Corpus Christi**, the great thanksgiving for the Institution of the Eucharist and the Real Presence of Christ in Communion. As the homily this weekend says, the introduction of this festival in 1264 was in response to a particular event in the central Italian town of Bolsena. However, a lively defence of the teaching on the Real Presence had been a feature of the Catholic faith for centuries. Most famous was the dispute centred on the French Benedictine abbey of Corbie, near Amiens, between the monk Ratramnus (†868) who maintained that the bread and wine only figuratively represent Christ's Body and Blood, over against his own abbot, Paschasius Radbertus (†865) who held that the bread and wine in the altar, at consecration, become identical with the Body and Blood of Christ. On Tuesday we keep the feast of our Patron, St. Boniface, once a monk of Nursling outside this city, who is given the title 'Apostle to Germany' and who forged strong links between the Papacy and the emerging monarchy of France which would develop into the famed 'Holy Roman Empire' Boniface is rightly regarded as a key figure in medieval Western civilisation and a person of whom we can be proud.

Finally on Friday comes the solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, a celebration of Jesus' universal and unrestricted love. It was a counterblast to the highly restrictive view of God's mercy promoted by the bishop of Ypres, Cornelius Jansen (†1638), which gave rise to the movement known as Jansenism, which became especially tenacious in parts of France, notably at the Cistercian convent of Port-Royal, south-west of Paris, prior to its forcible closure in 1709. The promoter of the devotion to the Sacred Heart was St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (†1690), at Paray-le-Monial in Burgundy, where she was supported by her Jesuit confessor, St. Claude de la Colombière.
