The exact spot John the Baptist was Born Hic Praecusor Domini Natus Est

I felt this euphoria as I step out of the plane Tel Aviv and touched the soils of the Holy Land. I heard the voice saying Jesus was here and I told myself that yes He was here and I am doing it in the footsteps of Jesus himself who said *come follow me*. Yes it has been a childhood dream to go see the Holy land as many of our Sunday children's liturgy portrayed Jerusalem as a place where Jesus was and so we could only picture that Jerusalem was not on this earth. So, when gradually my infant catechesis started to mean that much to me, there was only this burning desire and *Jerusalem a must go place*.

This pilgrimage to the Holy Land has been a life-changing experience, an absolute bliss and unique spiritual adventure. In itself it was another journey and a way to get closer to Jesus or to discover the roots of our Christian faith. It was a moment to SEE, SPEAK, TOUCH, HEAR, and FEEL aspects of the religious history that inspires every corner of the world from this Holy Land. It was also a time to make for me to see how connected I am / we are, to the people who as disciples first gazed on Jesus, meditated on his teachings and made it a personal message of everlasting conversion, which till date preserved the precious Christian heritage in this magnificent land.

JAFFA: First it was Jaffa in Nazareth the port from which Jonah sailed in an attempt to flee from God. I could sympathize with Johan as I vividly remember how in the Seminary, I had the thoughts of ending my studies for sacred Priesthood and embrace a more personal career. Yes God was calling me but the task ahead sometimes was enormously challenging and this is what Jonah experienced. Then the opportunity to celebrate Holy Mass on the Mount of the Beatitudes, on the grounds of the Church of the Beatitudes. Looking at the Situation in the Middle-East, Cameroon and the world, I prayed fervently "Happy are those who hunger and thirst for what is right; they shall be satisfied."

GALILEE: *The Sea of Galilee* I have in life made only one cruising in a ship; and that was in Florida –USA in the summer of 2016. It was a moment of extreme excitement and re-union with friends and clssamates after 33 years. However, that morning on the Sea of Galilee I experienced a different mood. It was quiet, peaceful and varied emotional feelings.

Today, Galilee is a popular resort town nestled in the backdrop of the Golan Mountains and an extended colourful landscape of beauty. The Ministry of Jesus in Galilee two thousand years ago is recorded in Sacred Scriptures. Of the thirty-three miracles documented in the New Testament, nearly a third of them took place in or around Galilee. In fact, the village of Capernaum is described in the Bible as being the *home town of Jesus*.

I had the fantasies of following Jesus with the crowd or entering the boat with him. We had time to read the Bible stories of Jesus in and around Galilee but especially in Capernaum – the Town of Jesus. You imagine being a disciple and gasping as you see Jesus walking on water. You imagine being tossed about in the frightening waves of a storm before Jesus brings the wind and noise to a standstill. You imagine casting a net into the calm waters and become completely overwhelmed as your boat nearly capsizes because of the miraculous haul of fish. Our sailing on the Sea of Galilee turned out to be something more than just fun. It was a worship experience a moving time of prayer. It was also time to be patriotic, singing the English Anthem – *God Save the Queen* and hoisting flags of various nationalities of our pilgrim Family.

There was truly an encounter with God. It has rightly been said several times that there is a deeply emotional transformation that takes place when a pilgrim sets out on the peaceful waters of the Sea of Galilee. This awe-inspiring sailing in a boat truly helps pilgrims connect with and understand the countless biblical stories that took place there. (To be Continued...)

"He Must Increase": Scott Hahn on the Nativity of St John the Baptist

The people in this week's Gospel are frightened and amazed by the mysterious events surrounding the birth of John. Only his mother and father, Elizabeth and Zechariah, know what this child will be. John the Baptist was fashioned in secret, knit by God in his mother's womb, as we sing in this Sunday's Psalm. From the womb he was set apart, formed to be God's servant, as Isaiah declares in this week's First Reading. The whole story of John's birth is thick with Old Testament echoes, especially echoes of the story of Abraham. God appeared to Abraham promising that his wife would bear him a son; He announced the son's name and the role Isaac would play in salvation history. The same thing happened to Zechariah and Elizabeth. Through His angel, God announced John's birth to this righteous yet barren couple. He made them call John a special name—and told them the special part John would play in fulfilling His plan for history.
