#### FOOD FOR THE JOURNEY OF LIFE:

Jesus Christ is our food for the journey of life. And it is important to understand this in the widest possible sense.

Jesus is the Eternal Word of God incarnate in human nature, the self expression of the Divine in humanity. Where can we see the image of God in humanity? We see it above all in Jesus who is completely from the Father.

So in the power of the Spirit we are called to learn from him who is humble and gentle of heart. So we gradually come to imitate him in our relationship with the Father and with our sisters and brothers. "To hear the teaching of the Father and learn from it is to come to me", Jesus says. This is putting into practice his invitation to "Follow me".

We have already received our life, our being, our flesh from the eternal, creative Word of God. And now, because of Jesus, we see that the Divinity is given in the flesh, in the Body & Blood, in the materiality of the same Jesus. Though having the "form of God" the eternal Word empties himself to be "in human form" (Philippians 2:6ff NRSV). The Divine "lives" in the limitations of the flesh, of the material world "even to accepting death, death on a cross". In the Resurrection the eternal Word returns to the Father taking the whole of creation back into the glory of God. So the whole universe is filled with the Divine Presence, God is "all in all" (Eph. 1:21; 4:10 & 1 Cor 15:28).

It is in this context that the Christ, the Eternal Word takes "the form of bread" ("*Each loving soul by thee is fed, with thine own self, in form of bread (& wine)*" from the hymn *O bread of heaven* by St Alphonsus Liguori).

The Eternal Word is lovingly giving life and being to all. Until we are awakened by the gift of faith we are spiritually asleep or dead ("Leave the dead to bury their dead" Matt. 8:22). In that sense the "fathers (who) ate the manna in the desert ....are dead", they did not have the full, conscious awareness of the Divine life in them.

The Eternal Word first takes on "the flesh" and by assuming human nature he gives divinity, divine life to all of humanity and suffuses all materiality with the presence of God. Then the Divine Word reveals the supreme love of God in the sacrifice of the cross. And the triumph of that love is received and acknowledged by the Father in the Resurrection. The great Passover (Paschal) Mystery, the Word passing from this world back to the Father is celebrated in the Eucharist. The Eucharist reveals to human consciousness this "mystery hidden for generations and centuries....The mystery is Christ among you, your hope of glory" (Col 1:26-27).

The Eucharist enables us to celebrate personally & communally the mystery of Christ among us and Christ in all creation. We cannot recognise the Body, Blood, Soul & Divinity of the Christ in the consecrated bread and wine and **not recognise at the same time** the Body, Blood, Soul & Divinity of the Christ in the brother or sister. As St Paul says they are the Body & Blood of Christ and the Divine love "fills the whole of creation" (Eph. 1:23) and though "we may be unfaithful, he (Christ) is always faithful **for he cannot disown his own self** (2 Tim 2:13).

We are awakened from the dead by this wonderful love and nurtured, guided and enriched by it. In the words of James Finley: "*If we are absolutely grounded in the absolute love of God that protects us from nothing even as it sustains us in all things, then we can face all things with courage and tenderness and touch the hurting places in others and in ourselves with love.*" (DMA)

A MESSAGE FROM FR PETER RYAN: There is an organisation in the Catholic Church in England and Wales well known by its initials -**Mmac** which stands for the **Movement for Married Clergy**. It was established in the mid 1970's and its purpose is to further the discussion of, and to promote the cause for, the acceptance of Married Priests within the Catholic Church in England and Wales in order that we might meet the needs of the Church in our time. The Eucharist is at the heart of the Christian Mission, and **Mmac** asks that those who are called to be priests should have the choice of leading either a married or celibate life. The time has surely come to revoke a discipline that has become a hindrance to vocations and an unfair limitation of individual freedom.

For many centuries there have been both married and unmarried Priests in the Eastern Churches belonging to the Catholic Church (& in the Catholic Church until about the 12th century). Through the action of Pope Benedict XVI<sup>th</sup> in 2011, when he introduced the Anglican Ordinariate in England and Wales, we Catholics in these two countries have had the experience of being served by both married and celibate Priests. Indeed, we have had that experience in this parish during the ministry of Monsignor Edwin Barnes, a Catholic priest who was formerly an Anglican Bishop. **Mmac** would like to see this experience extended beyond the boundaries of the Ordinariate.

Fr David and I have both been members of **Mmac** for many years and would like to extend an invitation to parishioners of the three parishes to join with us in this valuable organisation. If you should decide to join, you can obtain an application for membership form from the Fr David or myself.
