JESUS' FLESH & BLOOD: Jesus' language in John chapter 6 is surprisingly dramatic and risks being shocking and offensive (see next week!). This is because we can only receive and appreciate the Good News of God's love for us and God's life in us if we accept on faith: 1) that the Divine Word has really taken flesh & blood in Jesus; 2) that the Divine Word is flesh and blood in us; & 3) that the Divine Word gives life and being to all things, such that creation is God's "Body". These are not three separate "mysteries" but one mystery of the Divine presence in all things. Faith alone sees the true reality of the flesh and blood in Jesus, in us and in the bread and wine. To eat and drink is to believe and to believe is to eat and drink the whole Mystery, to absorb it on every level.

Eating the Flesh and Blood of Jesus is not a mere ritual action isolated from the rest of life. It is a personal, but not a private, encounter with the Christ. It can never be divorced from the community or from creation. This is why how we treat ourselves, others and how we treat creation are all part of it because they are all the flesh and blood of the Lord.

Jesus was a spiritual genius and artist because he took simple things used in everyday meals and, by a unique association with himself in the death and resurrection he was to experience, he created a transformational ritual. This ritual which we have come to call the "Mass" has been at the centre of Western Catholic Christianity since the beginning.

The Eucharist is first of all the celebration of God's work in Jesus freeing us from sin and death and sharing with us Divine life. For this free, undeserved grace we can only give heartfelt thanks, which is in fact the meaning of the word Eucharist. Secondly the Eucharist is invitation and challenge. The invitation is to be "one body, one spirit in Christ" so that we can no longer regard ourselves as separate from others. Rather we are invited to recognise our responsibilities for others and to others. The call is to treat others as ourselves, to love others as ourselves. This way of love is a challenge to accept the sacrifices love may ask of us. As Jesus gave his life and death for us, so we are called to give our living and our dying for one another.

In this way the Eucharist expresses something that is happening in our every day lives: a growing experience of gratitude to God and a growing capacity to love as Jesus has loved us. All this is made possible by the Holy Spirit who has been given to us. Eucharist reveals the ultimate pattern and purpose of our lives.

In the Eucharist we celebrate the gift of ourselves in God. Holy communion makes a powerful statement that God's life is in us, as the prayer at Mass says: "By the mingling of this water and wine may we come to share the divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share in our humanity". Holy Communion gradually attunes us and confirms us in this mystery of loving union with God. If God can take simple bread and wine and make them his body & blood how much more does God takes us and delight in us being the "body and blood of Christ" in the world today. This is not our doing, it is by God's graciousness alone. We are no better than anyone else, it is just that by faith, we are made aware of this relationship. This is the Good News to be shared respectfully with others.

God's big HUG and EMBRACE which is the Eucharist accompanies us at every stage of our lives. It is the hug and embrace of unconditional love which desires the best for us and nurtures the best in us. When we're very young its all hugs and kisses and comfort. As we grow its all hugs, kisses, comfort and encouragement. As we get older its all hugs, kisses, comfort, encouragement and challenge. As we get older still its all hugs, kisses, comfort, encouragement, challenge and a call to loving service and responsibility. We are never ready for so great a gift or for so much love. We respond gradually, sometimes enthusiastically, sometimes indifferently, sometimes we rebel, maybe upset at God for not making things go as we would like. As long as we keep returning to the Source in humility with as much acceptance as we can muster the grace continues its work. Everything is turned to our good once we allow ourselves to be caught up in the flow of God's love which fills the whole creation. (DMA)

A MESSAGE FROM FR PETER RYAN: There is an organisation in the Catholic Church in England and Wales well known by its initials -Mmac - which stands for the Movement for Married Clergy. It was established in the mid 1970's and its purpose is to further the discussion of, and to promote the cause for, the acceptance of Married Priests within the Catholic Church in England and Wales in order that we might meet the needs of the Church in our time. The Eucharist is at the heart of the Christian Mission, and Mmac asks that those who are called to be priests should have the choice of leading either a married or celibate life. The time has surely come to revoke a discipline that has become a hindrance to vocations and an unfair limitation of individual freedom.

Fr David and I have both been members of Mmac for many years and would like to extend an invitation to parishioners of the three parishes to join with us in this valuable organisation. If you should decide to join, you can obtain an application for membership form from the Fr David or myself.

A MAP OF THE SOUL: JUNG AND PRAYER: Saturday 15th September at the Wisdom Centre, Romsey. The day is led by Mary Dunn; Mary is a retired Clinical Psychologist and Cognitive Analytic Therapist and is now a Spiritual Director, living in the New Forest. Mary leads various workshops on Prayer. She has a particular interest in Carl Jung.

As a philosopher once said, 'The function of prayer is not to influence God, but rather to change the nature of the one who prays.' The Swiss psychologist Jung wrote extensively about religion and developed a 'Map of the Soul.' Jung's work has great bearing on prayer as part of our spiritual search. During this Day we will discover Jung's ideas on the self, on how we think, and how prayer may positively influence our everyday patterns of thought. Richard Rohr the Franciscan writer refers to prayer as a "transformation of the consciousness of the one doing the praying". During the day we will consider if this is true.
