ITS SOMETHING MORE THAN JUST BEING NICE

"Who do people say I am?" Jesus was perhaps testing the water with his followers. Had they begun to understand his true identity and mission? People generally thought Jesus was a prophet like John the Baptist, or Elijah or one of the others. Peter is able to see further: You are the Christ (i.e. the Anointed One). Jesus is not like the other prophets, in some mysterious way he is of God. So Jesus is able to take them further in his teaching.

Being God's Anointed is not going to mean popularity, political favour, generous campaign donations or religious respect. On the contrary it is going to mean suffering, rejection and death. Jesus will be rejected by all the systems of power: the civil authorities (elders), the religious authorities (chief priests) and the legal authorities (the scribes). However God will raise him to new life. Jesus says all this "quite openly".

Peter, true to character reacts impulsively. We understand where he is coming from. We too feel the same way. It is impossible for us to see the wisdom of all this. Like Peter we are locked into our all too human way of thinking. It is understandable, reasonable, what most would consider common-sense and yet Jesus says it is "satanic". It is the only time in the Gospels that Jesus calls anyone "Satan" directly.

This stark statement invites us to reconsider the nature and "place" of evil. It is much closer to home than we would like to admit. In fact we can't admit it because we don't even see it. We don't see because it's the way everyone thinks, ourselves included (hidden in plain sight). We take it for granted and would never ordinarily see any reason for thinking otherwise.

Following Jesus is going to take us on a journey that will completely transform our way of thinking and living. We are being invited into God's way of thinking, seeing and living. Uncomfortable as it maybe Christianity is about something greater than just being "nice" or "nicer" than others.

If we invest in, place all our hope and security in, give all our allegiance to the political system, the religious system, the economic system then we are going to lose. They cannot deliver the life of God. The struggle to re-align ourselves on God is the carrying of the cross. Our life, our hope, our joy are safe in God but the "gods" of this world demand total and slavish obedience and will fight any threat to their power. Jesus says: "Have courage. I have overcome the world". (DMA)
