GIVE THE JOY TO RECEIVE THE JOY

This Sunday was traditionally called "Laetare" Sunday – literally Rejoice Sunday. The Liturgy, that is the prayers and readings for the Eucharist and the Prayer of the Church, emphasises God's gift of peace and joy.

We all want peace, joy and happiness. The question we all have to answer is: Where will I find peace, joy and happiness? What or who will provide these blessings? Wise people tell us that joy has already been given. It is the natural state of the soul (the true self). In contrast anxiety and dissatisfaction is the natural state of the ego (the false self). So, leaving aside severe depression which is an illness and extremes of deprivation which are an injustice, what is it that prevents us experiencing the God given joy of the soul?

There is a critique of Western Christianity in general and it goes something like this. We are always seeking consolation and reassurance. Whenever we read the Bible, say our prayers or attend Mass we are primarily seeking consolation. The suggested reason for this is that deep down we are uneasy and insecure because we have really invested most of our hope in the things of this world: i.e. security in health, job, status, power, good-looks, money, possessions, qualities, virtues etc.

The effect of this is two-fold. First of all, the world is inherently insecure and uncertain and deep down we know we have built our house on sand. Secondly, because we have hedged our bets, so to speak, and have not made a radical (i.e. to the roots) choice for God and the ways of the Kingdom we are not able to receive the "peace of God, which is so much greater than we can understand". Hence our constant need for reassurance. Which is essentially a self-centred quest which prevents us from having the freedom and energy to address the problems of the world.

What the Bible offers is something different to the above. It offers Challenge. It invites a radical conversion to God—a deep change of mind and heart. The fruit of accepting the Challenge and undergoing the Conversion is the gift of a growing Peace and Joy. These come from the acceptance of God deep within. When we completely surrender to God and begin to know that "nothing can separate us from the love of God made visible in Christ Jesus" we will begin to experience the true peace and joy Jesus is talking about. This is always an on-going, life long process.

There are two main ways to this surrender of love, which ideally go hand in hand - silent prayer and life experience as we try to love as Jesus has loved us. These are ways of both joy and pain. Pain as we face our own resistance to change and our love of the false self and the world. Joy as God reveals Godself to us and sets us free to live from the joy of our true self. (DMA)
