WHAT WORDS REVEAL

Words can be true or false, helpful or hurtful, encouraging or discouraging, affirming or judgemental, soothing or spiteful. Our words reveal our hearts as the Scriptures confirm today. Are we generous, loving, forgiving, patient, hopeful, tolerant, peace-loving, compassionate, benevolent? Or are we mean, spiteful, angry, hostile, resentful, envious, jealous, judgemental, fearful, anxious, greedy, lustful, arrogant. Probably we can all recognise both the positive and the negative energies within us. We are a mixture of good and bad. Hopefully the good is stronger than the bad. Our words and sometimes our silences will reveal to ourselves and others what is going on inside us. We do not always want to make this kind of disclosure so there are some people we avoid or to whom we would rather not speak.

In the past if people wanted to hurt or abuse or mis-inform others they would do so by gossip or anonymous "poison-pen letters". Nowadays with the "cloak of invisibility" afforded by the internet some people are less inhibited. Vile and nasty slurs, threats and lies can be disseminated quickly and easily. Exposing the originators of this negativity is not an easy task.

But looking to remove the planks in our own eyes, what can we do for ourselves to nurture the good and disempower the bad? Firstly, we have to cultivate self-awareness in the light of Jesus Christ. We must note & reflect on our own words, those actually spoken and those only rehearsed in our hearts, bringing them before the Lord. We must let God's light search and reveal, expose and heal.

As Scripture says: everything brought out into the light will become light. The light of Christ takes away the "sting" of death, that is the guilt of sin produced by the accusations of the "Law". Bathed in the boundless love and forgiveness of God we can love ourselves in all our weakness. When we see ourselves in this way we begin to recover from that spiritual blindness which imagines God as a fearful, demanding tyrant. This blindness makes us presume to judge ourselves & then others and to try to correct the "specks" in their eyes. This distorted, negative, judgemental view of God, ourselves and others is one of the "planks" in our own spiritual eye. This is part of the "old self", the ego that has to die if the new self, the mind of Christ is to be "put on".

This new self is in fact our true self, who God made us and who we are eternally in the Christ, the Divine Word who gives life to all and who holds all things in being. The Christ is the divine connection in everything and everyone who holds together the spiritual and material, the infinite and the finite, the Divine and the created. The old self is just the unavoidable consequence of our emergence into created life, individuality and freedom within the limitations of vulnerability and mortality. Once we begin to believe and accept that we are really branches of the True Vine then the divine abundance can flow more easily through us, freeing us from fear, hopelessness and the desperation that makes us seek for fulfilment in passing things alone.
