Lent is a reminder to stop, to return to the essential, to fast from all that is superfluous and distracting. It is a wake-up call for the spirit. Lent is a journey of returning to the essential, during which the Lord asks us to follow three steps: almsgiving, prayer, and fasting

Chrism Mass

The **last** call for help! Can you sing? Are you a musician? Would you be willing to help at the Chrism Mass this Holy Week?

The Chrism Mass is the special Liturgy in Holy Week at which the Bishop blesses the three Holy Oils for use in the Sacraments: The Oil of Catechumens, the Oil of the Blessing of the Sick and the Oil of Chrism. The blessing of the Holy Oils is one of the most ancient ceremonies of the Church and it's always celebrated in the Cathedral with the priests, deacons, religious and lay people of the diocese. During it, all the priests make a renewal of their commitment to priestly service. This year, the Chrism Mass is at 11 o'clock in the Cathedral on Tuesday 16th April. Chris Olding has generously agreed to be the Director of Music for this year's celebration. Besides the organ, we're hoping this time to have a small orchestra and music group, alongside an ad hoc choir of volunteers from across the diocese. The music this year will be a blend of old and new, but with an emphasis on beauty - only the best for the Lord! At the moment Chris is finalising the schedule of music, but he is appealing for singers and musicians willing to assist. He intends to arrange a practice one evening in a couple of weeks' time, probably in the Eastleigh area.
