SHARING THE GOOD NEWS & BUILDING COMMUNITIES OF FAITH, HOPE & LOVE.

Today's first reading continues the account of the preaching of Paul and Barnabas and of God opening the door of faith to pagans. There is much travelling and activity, gathering of people and appointing leaders, and even a sense of work completed. By contrast, the Gospel draws us into the intimacy of the small group of disciples surrounding Jesus who encourages them to love one another. This is how people will know they are his disciples. Proclaiming the Word and witness of love for one another are both valid forms of evangelisation.

The post-conciliar document *Evangelii Nuntiandi* (1975) speaks of the need to proclaim Christ the Lord to those who do not know him through preaching, catechetics, baptism and the administration of the sacraments. It also recognises, as the first step in the work of evangelisation, communities of Christians who radiate simply and spontaneously their faith and love for one another and for those among whom they live. This role of pre-evangelisation has long been recognised in the Church's mission to the nations, formerly known as mission territories, where communities of religious sisters and brothers engaged in works of mercy prior to the arrival of priests who would preach in the traditional sense. In our post-Christian Western societies the witness of Christian love and service is needed more than ever as a form of evangelisation that may touch modern people in a way that formal

preaching does not. Both are needed, and witness to love, of which today's Gospel speaks, is the vocation of every Christian.

The reading from the Apocalypse presents a vision of heaven, the new Jerusalem, where all suffering and toil are ended. This echoes the Gospel where Jesus says: "The Son of Man has been glorified." Although he has yet to undergo the passion, in John's Gospel Jesus is already glorified. He is always one with the Father who has been glorified in him. In the new Jerusalem God will make his home among his people, his name is God-with-them, and the One sitting on the throne says, "Behold, I am making the whole of creation new." These readings both challenge and console a world that continues to experience war, famine and disease and the apparent lack of resolve of powerful nations to help the poor and suffering in our two-thirds world.

We can feel overwhelmed and powerless where so much is controlled by multinationals and superstates, but today's readings, summed up in the Gospel acclamation "I give you a new commandment: love one another, just as I have loved you", give us encouragement and assurance that we can make a difference. This is not an easy option, Jesus' love led him to the cross, but in Christian faith the cross is not an end in itself but stands at the centre of the paschal mystery of death and resurrection. It is the door through which we enter the new Jerusalem where all suffering is ended.
