THE GIFTS AND FRUITS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT IN OUR LIVES

The scriptures in Romans 12:6-8, 1 Corinthians 12:4-11, and 1 Peter 4:10-11 speak about the gifts of the Spirit. These are the *gifts of prophecy, wisdom, knowledge, faith, healings, grace, miraculous powers, distinguishing between spirits, speaking of tongues and interpretation of tongues.* These gifts are given "so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other" (1 Corinthians 12:25) so "that God in all things may be glorified through Jesus Christ" (1 peter 4:11).

As for the fruits of the Spirit, these are: "love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control" (Galatians 5:22). From this verse we understand that the true fruit of the Spirit, that indicates that the Spirit lives in a person and that shows that person is saved, begins with love.

The Christian life is a battle of the sinful flesh against the new nature given by Christ (2 Corinthians 5:17). As fallen human beings, we are still trapped in a body that desires sinful things (Romans 7:14-25). As Christians, we have the Holy Spirit producing His fruit in us and we have the Holy Spirit's power available to conquer the acts of the sinful nature (2 Corinthians 5:17; Philippians 4:13). A Christian will never be completely victorious in always demonstrating the fruits of the Holy Spirit. It is one of the main purposes of the Christian life, though, to progressively allow the Holy Spirit to produce more and more of His fruit in our lives—and to allow the Holy Spirit to conquer the opposing sinful desires. The fruit of the Spirit is what God desires our lives to exhibit and, with the Holy Spirit's help, it is possible. The cluster of fruit should characterize the life of every Christ-born child of God. We are to be filled with love, we are to have joy, we are to have peace, we are to have patience, we are to be gentle and kind, we are to be filled with goodness, we are to have faith, we are to have meekness, and we are to have temperance.

THE OLD YOU: Every person, before coming to Christ, is dominated by one nature—the "old man." You're controlled by your ego, your self. The moment you receive Christ as your Saviour, that self is put down. Christ is put on the throne in your life, and the Spirit of God dominates your life. However, self is still there—sometimes hidden, sometimes quiet—waiting for the opportunity and the chance to attack the citadel of your soul and take control again. You have the will as a Christian to yield either to the flesh and live a fleshly, carnal life; or to yield to the Spirit and live a Spirit-filled life. I cannot bear the fruit of the Spirit by my own strength. I cannot love, I cannot have joy, peace, long-suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness and temperance by myself. I have no power. But this Holy Spirit, who lives in me since I received Christ as my Saviour, is the one who gives me the power to love. He gives me the power to love. He gives me the power to love. He gives me the patience. He bears the fruit in my life.

The fruits of the Spirit:

Love "Dear children let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth" (1 John 3:18). Is your love unconditional? Or is your love most evident when everything goes your way? This type of

fruit keeps on loving even when it's difficult to show affection to others. The capacity to love grows out of the agape love from the heavenly Father. The first one is love, is the heart of it all, because all of them are wrapped up in this one word: *love*. There are three words for love in Greek. In English there is only one. But in Greek, *eros* is sensual love. *Philia* is love between friends or the love between a man and wife. And there is one word to describe supernatural love, God's love for us: *agape*.

Joy "*For the joy of the Lord is your strength*" (*Nehemiah 8:10*). Can you have joy in the chaos? Or does your moodiness hover over everyone like a cloud? Not that anyone should be joyful about the hard times, but rather your joy comes from #1) God is with you through it and #2) God uses every trial to help you become stronger in the faith. Seventy times in the New Testament it says that Christians should rejoice! Count it as joy, even when you face trials and tribulations and troubles. There is a vast difference between pleasure and Christian joy. Pleasure depends on circumstances. Many times it requires good health to really enjoy yourself. But Christian joy is completely independent of health or circumstances.

Peace "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:6-8). Is your inner person wrecked with anxiety and worry when everything falls apart? Or can you rest in God's peace?

Forbearance "Being strengthened with all power according to his glorious might so that you may have great endurance and patience" (Colossians 1:11). Can you be still and wait on God? Or are you tempted to always move ahead so you can stay in control? Forbearance is a fruit that will grow with your experience of being stretched in faith especially in times of trial. Forbearance is another word for patience; you don't have to pray for patience...it's there already!

Kindness "And the Lord's servant must not be quarrelsome but must be kind to everyone, able to teach, not resentful" (2 Timothy 2:24). Do others sense your kindness in words and actions? Or are they more accustomed to your angry response? A gentle word, a soft answer, or a helping hand—all demonstrate the fruit of kindness in this culture of rudeness and selfishness.

Goodness "Dear friend, do not imitate what is evil but what is good. Anyone who does what is good is from God. Anyone who does what is evil has not seen God" (3 John 11). Are your conversations marked with genuine virtue and honor? Or is your conversation tainted with worldly language, immoral tendencies, or gossip? Goodness doesn't mean that you are perfect, but rather someone who sincerely reflects the integrity of God within. A believer who demonstrates the fruit of goodness has the tendency to believe the best about people.

Faithfulness "*Now it is required that those who have been given a trust must prove faithful*" (*1 Corinthians 4:2*). Does your reputation reflect dependability and steadfastness in the faith? Or do people expect you to be late, undependable, or to drop off the map on a project? Your faithfulness represents God's Spirit dwelling within. Those who cultivate the fruit of faithfulness are compelled to complete every good work for His glory.

Gentleness *"Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near" (Philippians 4:5).* Is your meek spirit felt around those who live or work with you? Or do they feel that you are a hard and legalistic person to deal with? A spirit of <u>gentleness</u> gives grace freely and consistently. Believers and unbelievers should feel at ease around you because of your presence of gentleness.

Self-Control "For the grace of God has appeared that offers salvation to all people. It teaches us to say "No" to ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age" (Titus 2:11-12) Do you control your appetites? Or do they control you? Believers can demonstrate of life of self-control and discipline in a world where every day is an opportunity for gluttony. You have the power through the Spirit to control your cravings.

Results: Are we at 10%, 50% or 100% in your fruit productivity? What matters most is that We should not give up growing spiritual fruit. We cultivate it with the grace from Jesus Christ, aided by the Holy Spirit, strengthen by the the Word of God and the Eucharist, and with the fellowship of the saints. "*This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples" (John 15:8). Fr. George Ngwa*
