## **Corpus Christi**

This Sunday, 23rd June, is the great Feast of Corpus Christi. Pope Benedict XVI once said: "Everything begins, one might say, from the Heart of Christ, who, at the last supper on the eve of his Passion, thanked and praised God and by so doing, with the power of his love, transformed the meaning of death which he was on his way to encounter. The fact that the Sacrament of the Altar acquired the name 'Eucharist' – 'Thanksgiving' - expresses precisely this: that changing the substance of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is the fruit of the gift that Christ made of himself, the gift of the Love stronger than death, divine love which raised him from the dead. This is fine the Eucharist is the food of eternal life, the Bread of Life." This week and next, try to find some extra time to be with Jesus in the Tabernacle. After all, "it is pleasant to spend time with Him, to lie close to His breast like the Beloved Disciple and to feel the infinite love present in His Heart...How can we not feel a renewed need to spend time in spiritual converse, in silent adoration, in heartfelt love before Christ present in the Most Holy Sacrament?"
