SPECIAL COLLECTIONS: THIS WEEKEND - 13th/14th JULY - APOSTLESHIP OF THE SEA (National Obligatory)

THE WORD IS NEAR - IT IS IN OUR LIVES

I think the Scripture readings for this weekend have something useful to say to us. Moses tells us: The word is very near to you. It is in your mouth and in your heart. This is a gift we need to use to the full. If we could really tune into our deeper selves, the true self that is in God then the way of life, love and truth will shine out more clearly. We will hear the word of God not just spoken generally but spoken to us individually and to us collectively as a community. We do need to hear the prophetic word for our situation. The obstacles to that word are the different forms of fear and self-interest.

Our second reading, from Paul's letter to the Christians at Colossae, tells us we are part of a much bigger story, God's story in God's creation. This should give us encouragement and hope. God is doing a great work of reconciliation and peace. If we trust in the Spirit given to us and working through us (and given to others and working through others too!) then we will be used by God in a positive way. Even our difficulties and disappointments can be used by God to renew us and make us better able to serve.

Our Gospel has the heretic Samaritan doing what it takes to inherit eternal life. While in contrast the orthodox, observant temple priest and Levite pass by on the other side. If they help the injured person they will become contaminated and unable to do their religious duties. The point of the parable is that it is more important to do the right thing (orthopraxis) than to have our own ideas of being in the right (orthodoxy). (DMA)

Marriage is the central vocation because male and female make up the image of God. Family and relationship are the primary paths through which we can grow in love for God and one another. "No one has ever seen God, as long as we love one another, God will live in us and his love will be complete in us" (1 John 4: 12). We are drawn out of ourselves by loving, caring relationships, learning to live with both joy and sorrow, making the sacrifices that love asks of us (carrying our Cross) and nurturing the next generation. From this primary and foundational grounding love God draws towards the universal love of Christ which transcends every boundary and limitation. Charity begins at home but it must end by reaching out to all. (DMA)
