BEING MINDFUL OF THE POOR & THE CREATION

CONTEXT: The Gospel warns us against inflating our own importance & presuming to judge the worth of others. It also encourages us to be mindful of the poor and be motivated by pure benevolence and not self-interest. True care for others cannot be isolated from care for the world in which we live and which sustains us.

PRAYER: St Paul wrote: Rejoice with those who rejoice and be sad with those in sorrow. Treat everyone with equal kindness; never be condescending but make real friends with the poor. Do not allow yourself to become self-satisfied. Never repay evil with evil but let everyone see that you are interested only in the highest ideals. Do all you can to live at peace with everyone. (Rom 12: 15-18) Let this inform our prayer that by God's gracious action in our hearts and minds we may grow in loving humility, in care for others and for God's creation.

ACTION: our church community provides a great context where all can be respected equally, irrespective of personal circumstances. Our church functions and events are open to all. Does this have an impact on our personal lives as well? An unexpected invitation motivated in part by an anxious sense of duty or guilt may not go down well. However the patient process of building friendships with different people is mutually enriching and stimulating. An invitation that follows a growing friendship is spontaneous and untainted by any self-interest. Such an invite is appreciated by all. Finally there is much incentive to care for the planet in how we use energy & how we conserve resources. (DMA)
