IMPOSSIBLE DISCIPLESHIP?

CONTEXT: We need to read the Acts of the Apostles to get the context here. Paul, Barnabas, Mark & Luke preaching the Gospel, experiencing rejection and hardship. Believers in Jesus risking the loss of family and possessions. People

PRAYER: Of course we must love everyone and hate no-one. We should be grateful for family & friends, for having more than just the bare necessities. But not all allegiances are compatible with our allegiance to Christ. Do our possessions possess us? At a simplistic level we cannot be Jesus's disciples. He is asking too much of us. However, we can "sue for peace" as the parable says. We can pray that what is impossible for us may be made possible by God's grace. We can examine our priorities. We can gradually change from being possessors to being good stewards of God's gifts. We can embrace the cross daily with God's help.

ACTION: If we are just thinking about ourselves and our own advantage we are not going to be inclined to help others. If we see ourselves as primarily possessors we won't be inclined to generosity. In Christian life some are called to embrace a more radical Gospel life-style, a sort of fast track to Christ-like attitudes and relationships. Most of us take a more meandering course and hopefully, by God's grace, arrive at the same point. The goal for everyone is what St Paul called the fruits of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness & self-control. Helping others and supporting the needy is an important imperative in our Christian life & helps us grow as disciples. (DMA)
