Prayer for Creation: Father, Lord of all creation, we praise you with all your creatures and the whole universe that comes forth from the work of your hands. We acknowledge the privilege and responsibility that you give us as stewards of your creation. In our ignorance we have done damage to our common home and our brothers and sisters are suffering. Through faithfully following your Son guide and direct us to prepare for a better future. Teach us to contemplate you in the beauty of the universe, for all things speak of you. Give us the grace to recognise, respect and protect all you have created, using wisely all that you have entrusted to us. Holy Spirit, who first hovered over the dawn of creation and drew order out of the chaos help us to build your kingdom of justice, love, peace and beauty where the poor of the earth are crying out. You, who live and reign, world without end, Amen.

#### **CORE CATHOLICISM & INITIATIVE**

In the Gospel for this Sunday Jesus praises the astuteness or initiative of the dishonest steward and commends such creative thinking (not the dishonesty) to his disciples.

I want to reflect on what is core Catholicism and what may be some of the initiatives that will helps us be faithful to God's grace and help us to serve the secular, multi-cultural society in which we live.

Core Catholicism is all about love. Not just any love but the unique kind of love God has shown us in Jesus. As John puts it; we are to love then, because God has first loved us, (1 John 4:19). For Jesus' people the Commandments were at the centre. For the followers of Jesus the centre is the loving heart of the Father, the law was given through Moses, grace and truth have come through Jesus Christ, (John 1:17). Core Catholicism is accepting God's love as a gracious gift, learning to love God in return and loving others as Jesus has loved us. Everything else, dress, devotions, rituals etc. is peripheral and subservient to this.

We should not be surprised or disconcerted to realise that what is central and most important to us is also central and most important to every other Christian. It is also the heart of every great world religion and spiritual path. We should be delighted by the common ground we share. The Word has enlightened all peoples so it is only to be expected that the seeds of the Word (cfr. St Ireneaus) have produced a similar fruit among the other sheep who are not of this fold (John 10:16).

The initiative that is called for from the children of light is nothing new. It is putting good deeds before fine words. It is giving & showing compassion, respect, good will, patience, perseverance, love of enemies and every other virtue. It is speaking truth to power both inside and outside the church. It is bravely following the guidance of the Holy Spirit who gives us courage to change the things that must be changed, serenity to accept what we cannot change and wisdom to know the difference.

We must use the wonderful discoveries of science to enrich & expand our understanding of Christ. We need to discover through dialogue what unites us with other Christians, other faiths & those of no faith and together seek to alleviate suffering in the world. We need to shift the emphasis from a backward looking understanding of Jesus (i.e. what Jesus means in terms of the Jewish tradition and experience over 2000 yrs ago) to a present, cosmic, understanding of the Christ. This means learning to see the Divine reality (the Word) at the heart of the unfolding of the universe. Realising that Christ is at the heart of everything means everything belongs and everything "in heaven and on earth" is reconciled, (Eph. 1:10). This is GOOD NEWS that we can be proud of, God's goodness is something we can boast about, God's love is something we can joyfully dedicate our lives to. (DMA)

FIRE WARDENS NEEDED: The recent evacuation drill has indicated that we need to increase the pool of Fire Wardens at St Francis, particularly to cover for unforeseen and short notice absences. The job is essentially to assist parishioners to evacuate the church in a safe and timely fashion in the event of an emergency or during a practice drill. It is particularly necessary for Sunday Masses and on Christmas Day when the number of worshippers is greatest and when we maintain full Warden cover. There is just one mandatory drill per year. The job requires no specific skills or experience although a cool head, commitment and reliability are very important qualities as is a reasonable level of fitness and agility. A regular Sunday attender would be preferred but is not essential as absences can usually be accommodated. Training will be given. HEALTH & SAFETY: To the congregation at 10.30am Mass at OLMSJ. Thank you for your patience with the new evacuation procedure on Sunday. The Diocese and our Insurers insist we have an evacuation plan which has to be taken seriously. Fires in church, while occupied is rare, but it does happen and we must be prepared. Only a few years ago there was a serious fire in the Fish & Chip shop next door which could have affected our property. But this Evacuation plan, is not just for fire, it has to cover any situation where the church has to be evacuated. Whatever happens your safety is important to us. Please don't see the Evacuation plan as a nuisance, but as a necessity. It could save your life one day. This is what we have learnt from Sunday: Watch & listen to the Fire Wardens and take direction; Please move quickly when the warden asks you to; In cases of emergency there is no need to genuflect but if you feel you must do so while still in your pew, not in the aisle; Go straight to the Muster point; Do not move your car as people are moving around you; If you have mobility issues the Fire Warden will get you out of the building.

THANK YOU TO OUR FIRE WARDENS: I'd like to take this opportunity to thank the Fire Wardens for their diligence, understanding and commitment. Thank you to the two people who offered to be additional Fire Wardens for this Mass. The more Fire Wardens we have the easier an evacuation will be. Please see myself, Pete Lawes or Linda Guilding if you'd like to help to keep our parishioners safe. Thank you Fr David

HEALTH & SAFETY: On Sunday morning, as we were evacuating the church, people were trying to move their vehicles, this was not safe. May I ask, unless you are bringing someone with mobility issues, if you have to leave church in your car early or promptly at the end of Mass, please park in the public car park and walk through. Obviously if you are leaving the car park after the church has emptied please park in the church car park as usual.
