Prayer for Creation: Father, Lord of all creation, we praise you with all your creatures and the whole universe that comes forth from the work of your hands. We acknowledge the privilege and responsibility that you give us as stewards of your creation. In our ignorance we have done damage to our common home and our brothers and sisters are suffering. Through faithfully following your Son guide and direct us to prepare for a better future. Teach us to contemplate you in the beauty of the universe, for all things speak of you. Give us the grace to recognise, respect and protect all you have created, using wisely all that you have entrusted to us. Holy Spirit, who first hovered over the dawn of creation and drew order out of the chaos help us to build your kingdom of justice, love, peace and beauty where the poor of the earth are crying out. You, who live and reign, world without end, Amen.

INDULGENCE BEGETS BLINDNESS

It is very easy to become "ensconced so snugly" as the first reading puts it. We isolate ourselves from other people's problems and sufferings. We perhaps unconsciously bury our own fears and anxieties by constant distraction, busyness or indulgence. In Jesus's time some people reassured themselves that if they were materially blessed it meant that God was smiling on them. That delusion is still around today under different guises, e.g. the so-called "prosperity Gospel". In a rather shocking way Jesus destroys that self-justifying fantasy. However, in exposing one injustice it seemingly creates another. The poor person's sufferings were at least temporary; those of the heartless, indulgent person are apparently endless. There will only be love in heaven. Everything that is not held in love will pass away. The old self or the ego will pass away, the true self, the Christ-self in us will remain.

The gospel parable is also a comment on the question why only a few of the Jewish responded positively to the proclamation of Jesus's Resurrection. The reason given is that they had not listened to Moses or the prophets.

So let us open ourselves to God's grace which alone can transform us and create us anew. Grace helps live according to our Christ-self. It unmasks the ego as an empty impostor.

Let us work to build faith communities that are open and inclusive yet dedicated and responsible. We want commitment but not judgement, strong faith but not narrow-mindedness. We want love that is neither cliquey nor cloying; service of others that is not proud, patronising or self-serving. We want patient compassion with strong ideals. We want to be in fellowship with the national and universal church not as mindless slaves but as brothers and sisters who share the one Spirit.

Such a community is ultimately the work of God's Spirit but God cannot do it without us. For our part there must be some reality to our faith. Are we keen to worship and celebrate the Eucharist? Are we striving to put the word of Jesus into practice through caring and compassionate action? Are we strangers to our faith community or do we support it and take part in it? (DMA)
