PERSEVERING PRAYER

Jesus encourages us to pray continually and not to lose heart (Luke 18:1). We do this with the help of our Friend and Advocate, the Holy Spirit who comes to help us in our weakness. For when we cannot choose words in order to pray properly, the Spirit herself expresses our plea in a way that could never be put into words, and God who knows everything in our hearts knows perfectly well what she means, and that the pleas of the saints expressed by the Spirit are according to the mind of God, (Romans 8:26ff).

To pray continually we do not need to use many words. Indeed Jesus expressly told us **not** to use many words because our Heavenly Father knows what we need before we ask. We pray continually with the desire of our hearts which can be wordlessly lifted up to the Father. This desire of the heart is like the flame of a candle that burns all day and all night. Whatever we do, whether we are awake and busy or asleep and oblivious to everything the desire of our hearts is present to *God who knows everything in our hearts*.

We pray with the confidence and trust that God knows what is best for us and everyone else. We pray respecting God and trusting that, even though we do not understand and probably couldn't even begin to comprehend all that God is doing, everything is being worked out for our good and everyone else's good too. We pray conscious of the paradox of time in which the waiting can seem endless but once we arrive at the shore the time that has passed seems to have gone "speedily".

We may begin prayer thinking we have got to change God's mind.

When we have persevered in prayer we realise God has been changing our mind to see and understand in a new way, in God's way.

We may begin prayer as a relatively isolated individual with personal concerns, naively imagining the world revolves around us. When we have persevered in prayer we find that we are a small part of a vast whole that comes from God and returns to God in a great flow of love.

We may begin prayer lonely, fearful, anxious, guilt-ridden, wounded, enslaved and lacking self-worth. As we persevere in prayer and come to know Jesus (who described himself as gentle and humble in heart) we experience a growing joy, confidence, peace, healing, freedom and we begin to experience the effects of God's perfect love for us which casts out all our fear, (1 John 4:17ff).

We may begin prayer resisting and rejecting everything, especially the situation that faces us here and now. When we have persevered in prayer we no longer regret the past nor fear the future. We learn to accept and even enjoy the present moment and let it be what it is in its ISNESS - a reflection of the Divine Mystery in the here and now of this passing, finite world. It is prayer that connects us to the One who does not pass away. God is never disconnected from us we must keep connected to God! (DMA)

As we continue this Extraordinary Month of Mission, please continue to join in praying for missionaries around

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: beginning in November, each weekend, after one of the Sunday Masses I will be offering the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, a sacrament both of healing and forgiveness. It is for serious conditions of mind or body and can be received more than once. It should not be delayed, as they say: "the sooner the better". The particular Mass will be identified in the Service schedule. Over the course of a month I will try to include, at least once, each of our three churches and each Sunday Mass time. The first opportunity will be on Sun., 3rd Nov. after the 10.30am Mass at OLMSJ; then after the 6pm Mass at St Anne's, on 10th Nov; then after the 6pm Mass at OLMSJ, on 16th Nov; then after the 9am Mass at St Francis, on 17th Nov; then after the 6pm Mass at OLMSJ, on 23rd Nov. Depending on numbers the celebration of the Anointing of the Sick takes about 10-15 mins.
