RECOVERING THE GOSPEL PRIORITIES OF THE KINGDOM

However much we may resent the idea, reality is essentially hierarchical. A human cell in the body is an individual entity but it exists only as part of a higher organising principle - an organ of the human body, e.g. heart, lung, etc. The individual organ has a wholeness of its own but it is only a part of the human body which is itself a whole. A human being is biologically part of the planet, genetically a link in the evolutionary process, emotionally, psychologically, culturally and spiritually part of a family / tribe / society / religion / ideology. The planet is part of the solar system, the solar system part of the galaxy, the galaxy part of the Universe. And for those with faith the Universe is the finite manifestation of the Infinite, the Divine. The laws of nature as we have come to understand them on this planet, with its unique set of conditions, have enabled a marvellous, beautiful and terrifying complexity of life at all levels of being. Given the right conditions the Universe has an incredible capacity to enable life which emerges from within the dynamics of its own potential. God has created a self-creating Universe. What we discern are hierarchies of enablement and empowerment.

In the ancient world sovereigns could be tyrants, dictators, absolute rulers and they usually created **hierarchies of domination and control** ruled by both fear and favour. For the Jewish people, once they had adopted the rule of the sovereign, monarchy could be a blessing or a curse, or a bit of both. As their history progressed its wise people longed for a sovereign who would be faithful to God and act justly towards the people.

The followers of Jesus, experiencing his goodness, love, freedom, holiness, his universal acceptance and embrace of all of humanity, came to realise this was the only kind of sovereign, priest or prophet they wanted. He proclaimed the Kingdom of God which cannot be outwardly observed because it only exists in the relationships that people have among themselves and with God (Luke 17: 20-21). It is the Holy Spirit binding us together in love. In John's Gospel (10:10) the Divine Word says: I have come that they may have life and have it to the full. The creative Word (the Christ) is an enabler, an empowerer, a giver of life.

At long last a change is happening the Church. People are no longer accepting hierarchies of domination and control. They acknowledge only leadership that listens and learns, that shows respect, that is humble, that is enabling and empowering, that is inclusive of everyone, that proclaims the priority of love, mercy and compassion. Theologies of fear or favour no longer terrorise or seduce.

People are recognising their God-given baptismal dignity and responsibility as priests, prophets and sovereigns. The Church has to detach itself from its alliance with the rich and powerful and shed the trappings of patriarchal power. Pope Francis is inviting the universal Church to live the Gospel imperatives & priorities by serving God in the poor, extending God's compassion to all and giving voice and empowerment equally to women and men.
