#### **The Rite of Election**

The Rite of Election, which normally takes place on the Saturday after Ash Wednesday, takes place this year in the Cathedral on Saturday 29th February at 1100h – and I want to invite you to come and join us for it! The Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion, to give it its full title, is the liturgy in which those adults who are preparing for Baptism this Easter, and those who are being received into full communion with the Catholic Church, are presented to the Bishop for the Church's blessing. For the 'catechumens' (those under catechesis for Baptism) especially, this Rite is important: it's the moment in their formation when they are formally 'elected' or chosen by the Bishop, on the testimony of their godparents and others, to become members of the Church. Their names are inscribed in the Book of the Elect to signify that they have heard the Lord calling them by name and that they wish to respond publicly to His call.
