<u>Diocesan Day of Prayer and Fasting for an End to the Coronavirus Pandemic</u> Bishop Philip writes...

Many thanks to everyone who joined in the diocesan Day of Prayer and Fasting for an End to the Coronavirus Pandemic last Friday, 27th November. I've had a number of emails expressing gratitude and telling us what happened in their parish or area and what they did to join in. I was most impressed to see the numbers here in the Cathedral during the day, and also in the middle of the night.

This Sunday, is the **Second Sunday of Advent**, a short season of four Sundays leading up to Christmas. Advent is a time when we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus at Christmas and when we renew our desire for His second coming at the end of time. True, Advent can be busy. There's food to order, gifts to buy, cards to send. But spiritually, what should we be doing during this Advent season? We should be praying to God for the theological gift of hope and the renewal of that gift in our lives. We often pray to God for deeper faith and deeper charity but how often do we pray for stronger hope, the hope that comes from the indwelling of the Holy Spirit in our hearts? Hope is essential to the Christian life. It's hope that gives us joy, energy, enthusiasm; it makes us smile; it puts a spring in our step; it assures us that with God the impossible can be possible, that obstacles can be overcome, that the gloom can be transformed into light. More, it is hope that enables us to glimpse the joy of our true home in heaven.
