NEWS FROM FR CHARLIE IN MALAWI: A few parishioners sent a donation to Father Charlie about 3 months ago and he sent a thank you email and said they were not too badly affected with covid19 and the hot weather seemed to help.

He has now sent the following update and I think they now clearly need our prayers. "Here in Malawi the C19 situation is getting worse. Much worse than last year. It's this new variant originating from South Africa, which is now in Malawi. 7 Montforts (2 priests and 5 seminarians) are currently all down with C19 and last week 2 diocesan priests and one religious sister died. They all had C19. Schools are all closed and people are meant to wear masks in public places but most people don't as they don't have them. We continue with church services but the maximum number allowed to attend is 50. Stay safe and God bless,'
