### Suspicion a big barrier and a hindrance to evangelization

Saul who was once a fierce persecutor of the Church, became a convert and a follower of the mission he tried to stop. But there was problem as the others did not think his conversion from Saul to Paul was genuine. Since they feared him, their **suspicion** of him grew and so was their every attempt to distant themselves from him. Well, let's start with the biblical teaching that this kind of doubting or suspicion as a habit is unloving and therefore wrong. St. Paul in 1Cor. 13:7 says "Love bears all things, believes all things, endures all things." And *the very least* that Paul means when he says love believes all things and hopes all things, *the very least* that he means is that we should not be unduly suspicious about other people's motives. Love hopes for the best from people, not the worst. Love does to others what we would have done to us. And we don't like people to second-guess our motives. You don't like it when people impute to you motives that are not there, so you shouldn't do that to others either.

#### Free from the Stronghold of Suspicion

It's hard to avoid being suspicious because of all the variations of right and wrong today. Suspicion creates a looming darkness and expectation of evil where we would prefer goodness. It seems the world is no longer in the hands of Christians who want to do God's will, but in the hands of the latest whim of people who are only concerned with political correctness.

Protecting the innocent is good. But who are the innocent today? Protecting the innocent and convicting criminals used to be the focus of every aspect of the law because every aspect of the law was conformed to God's law and the ten commandments. To love, honour and respect God and parents, to love our neighbour, to not steal, commit adultery, murder, lie or falsely accuse, and to aid the helpless was a natural bi-product of following the commandments. Anyone performing outside these boundaries was rightly suspect.

Today we must know and follow what we believe and believe what we know written in the confines of Biblical teaching. Otherwise confusion sets in and without warrant, the innocent are suspect and the guilty are protected.

Suspicion becomes a stronghold in our lives when we refuse to put God first, give our lives to Him, and allow the Holy Spirit to guide us, and God to protect us. When suspicion becomes a stronghold it can debilitate us and prevent us from seeing the good, the light, the blessings, and the potential.

There's only one way to avoid being suspicious today and still be safe. Love. Love covers a multitude of sin. When we walk in love, we are above suspicion. We no longer suspect or allow this stronghold to control our thinking. That does not mean we neglect discernment, allow evil to triumph, or stop praying. It means we no longer allow suspicion to control us.

### If we find ourselves having (feeling) these sinful suspicions when someone complements or praises us, I can think of at least four simple things:

- 1) This is a kind of anxiety they need, the anxiety that people's praise is not real praise, but manipulation. They don't really think we are as good as they just said we are. So Jesus's words about anxiety in the Gospel of St Matt 6:27 apply here. He says, "And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life?" In other words, Jesus really did think that it would make a difference if we remind ourselves that this anxious suspicion of others' motives does no good. It doesn't help us. It doesn't add anything to our life. It only makes relationships harder and not better. Jesus thought that thinking that would help. So I think, thinking it helps too, and I commend it. Don't do it because it is useless.
- 2) Search your own heart. Could it be that your suspicion of their ulterior motives of others is owing largely to the fact that you yourself are so prone to operate this way when you praise, and you are reading your own motives into theirs? So increase your own habit of praising others whenever there is real reason to praise them just because you enjoy spilling over with admiration that you feel. And let thankfulness overflow to God when somebody does something good in your presence. Speak it out. And maybe the more you form the habit of praising others this way, the less you will automatically assume others would do anything differently for you.
- 3) Resolve that when someone praises you, you will return genuine thanks, but will not even think of some kind of payback that they could get from you. You won't give them any payback. And if they are after something, maybe your authentic gladness in receiving the praise minus any payback will dry up the ulterior motives because they don't work. Meanwhile, you get the pleasure of their praise without worrying about their motives.
- 4) And the last thing would be to cover all of this with prayer. Pray and ask God to fill you with love and to take away the bent towards suspicion.

# Has the world gone too far in the wrong direction? Is it possible to avoid suspicion? Some Biblical tips on avoiding suspicion:

- 1. Be ready to believe the best of every person. There is good somewhere in the worst of us. Look for that good and pray about the rest while you are protecting your rights, loved ones, and home. (1 Corinthians 13:7) Love bears up under anything and everything that comes, is ever ready to believe the best of every person, its hopes are fadeless under all circumstances, and it endures everything.
- 2. Follow God's law. Allow the fruit of the spirit to live within you.
- Ephesians 5:9-12. For the fruit of the Light or the Spirit consists in every form of kindly goodness, uprightness of heart, and trueness of life. Learn what is pleasing to the Lord and let your lives be constant proofs of what is most acceptable to Him.
- 3. Never take the law of God into your own hands. God himself will repay. Romans 12:19 Never avenge yourselves, but leave the way open for [God's] wrath; for it is written, Vengeance is Mine, I will repay each man according to his deeds, says the Lord.
- Hebrews 10:30 For we know Him Who said, Vengeance is Mine [retribution and the meting out of full justice rest with Me]; I will repay, I will exact the compensation, says the Lord. And again, The Lord will judge and determine and solve and settle the cause and the cases of His people.
- 4. *Never give in to an occasion of sin or lawlessness*. Following God's guidance from his word will justify all your actions as long as you put the first and greatest commandment above all others. 2 Timothy 2:15 Study and be eager and do your utmost to present yourself to God approved and be a workman who has no cause to be ashamed; correctly analysing and accurately teaching the Word of Truth.
- 5. Forgive each other. Resolve any problem and warn a fellow believer before suspicion takes over. Warn others. Hate evil, avoid evil doers, love your enemy. Follow God's law without judging it. James 4:11 [My] brethren, do not speak evil about or accuse one another. He that maligns a brother or judges his brother is maligning and criticizing God's Law found in the Bible and judging the Law. But if you

judge the Law, you are no longer practicing it but judging it. 2 Thessalonians 3:14-16 Take special note of anyone who does not obey our instruction in this letter. Do not associate with them, in order that they may feel ashamed. Yet do not regard them as an enemy, but warn them as you would a fellow believer.
