A COACH TRIP TO THE NATIONAL GALLERY IN LONDON: A proposal has been put forward, to hold a Coach Outing to London, to visit the **National Gallery** in Trafalgar Square, where an exhibition is being held, depicting the life and legacy of St. Francis of Assisi, with various works of art and artifacts from around the world on display.

A provisional booking has been made with Excelsior Coaches Ltd., to provide a 53 seat coach for the day's outing on Wednesday, 28/06/2023, commencing at 9.00 am from the Milford on Sea Church and return to there by 7.00 pm that evening. That would get us to London just after mid -day to see the exhibition, then give free time for everyone to disperse and do as they please, before convening back at Trafalgar Square at 3.45 pm. to commence the journey back home.

There is no charge for entry to the National Gallery, but we will need to arrange tickets in advance, for everyone attending. The cost of the coach works out at £25.00 per person attending. That requires a minimum number of 34 people to come. Any number of people less than that would mean it would not be financially viable and we would have to cancel it. On the other hand, if we can get up to 50 attending, there would be a considerable refund to everyone concerned. Booking forms are available at the back of our churches. But they must be returned next weekend, 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> June, so that the booking can be confirmed.
