The Divine Beauty, Goodness and Truth is made visible in the Christ. The exchange or flow of life and love between the Invisible and Visible (the Christ) is the Spirit.

The God who is love can only be truly known and loved in freedom. We are that part of the Christ mystery that can, by the Spirit, begin to respond in love and freedom to the One who is the Source of all, the Divine Mother/Father. We are invited to receive the love and to let the love flow through us and to give the love to everyone and everything.

That is why our relationships with others are so important. Every opportunity to help, encourage, support, forgive, heal, strengthen, to share, to receive and so on, is an opportunity to let God's love flow in and out of us to the other.

In God we live and move and have our being (Acts 17:28); the God who is, who was, and who is to come (Rev 1:8). God is in all and through all and with all (Eph 4:6). Everything exists from God, through God and for God (Rom 11:36). Glory be to God the Father through Jesus Christ his Son in the unity of the Holy Spirit, for ever and ever. Amen. (DMA)

TO ALL THOSE FROM LYMINGTON, BROCKENHURST AND MILFORD ON SEA PARISHES WHO VISIT THE SICK/HOUSEBOUND AS A EUCHARISTIC MINISTER, VISIT THE HOUSEBOUND/SICK AS REPRESENTATIVE OF THE PARISH, OR WORK WITH OUR CHILDREN ON ANY CATECHETICAL PROGRAMME.

The Diocesan Safeguarding dept is offering an up-to-date, face-to-face safeguarding training tailored to your roles in ministry. To avoid Ministers having to travel to Southampton, Maidenhead or further afield, I asked Safeguarding if they would consider putting on a training course specifically for the parishes in the New Forest Pastoral Area, and they have agreed.

The training is compulsory for Ministers of Communion who visit the sick/ housebound, and anyone else who visits the housebound/vulnerable representing the parish on a regular basis. And to all those in recruitment for, or currently working in, roles with children: 1st Holy Communion, Confirmation and Children's Liturgy catechists. In accordance with the National Safeguarding Standards, the training must be completed every 2

years.
There is a certificate on completion of this training. This training is, of course, in addition to DBS checks.

If you are a Minister of Communion, or visit the sick as a representative of the parish, or are involved with- or would like to get involved as a catechist for children, please contact the parish office asap. 01590 676696 office@lymbrockmil.org.uk. The date for the training has been given as Saturday 16th September either morning or afternoon, or both, depending on the age group(s) you are involved with. The venue has yet to be decided, depending on numbers, but it will be in the New Forest.

STAINED GLASS WINDOW OLMSJ: (extract from an email to Lisa who was responding to an enquiry) "Many thanks for that very helpful information. I have consulted a stained-glass expert who thinks that the window was made by John Hardman & Co, for whom the famous architect AWN Pugin provided the designs until his early death in 1852. Although the Lymington church is later the window behind the altar is very much in his style. The practice of commemorating donors in windows was used by Pugin at Hansom's brother's (Charles) church of Our lady of Dolours at the former Stapehill Abbey in Dorset. Also of 3 lights and tracery, it incorporated St John on the left and St Anne on the right to commemorate John Hardman and his wife who donated the window in 1850. Sadly, this window was damaged in WW2 and became unsafe and had to be removed in the 1960s, and probably lost. The Lymington window is therefore a very important example of this type of window!"

A COACH TRIP TO THE NATIONAL GALLERY IN LONDON: where an exhibition is being held, depicting the life and legacy of St. Francis of Assisi, with various works of art and artifacts from around the world on display.

A provisional booking has been made with Excelsior Coaches Ltd., to provide a 53 seat coach for the day's outing on Wednesday, 28/06/2023, commencing at 9.00 am from the Milford on Sea Church & picking up at Lymington, Brockenhurst and return to there by 7.00 pm that evening. That would get us to London just after mid-day to see the exhibition, then give free time for everyone to disperse and do as they please, before convening back at Trafalgar Square at 3.45 pm. to commence the journey back home.

There is no charge for entry to the National Gallery, but we will need to arrange tickets in advance, for everyone attending. The cost of the coach works out at £25.00 per person attending. That requires a minimum number of 34 people to come. Any number of people less than that would mean it would not be financially viable and we would have to cancel it. If we can get up to 50 attending, there would be a considerable refund to everyone concerned. Booking forms are available at the back of our churches. But they must be returned this weekend, 3rd/4th June, so that the booking can be confirmed.
