Commitment, Growth and Generosity

Jesus's words are quite uncompromising. He doesn't give us much wiggle (or wriggle) room. And let's face it we still manage to wiggle (or wriggle) our way out of what he is calling us too. There is a context here. In Jesus's time there wasn't much tolerance of difference. Stark choices had to be made and choices had serious consequences. Today our choices have consequences too. These choices may not have dramatic repercussions on the surface but we do need to ask ourselves just where our lives are heading. The almost imperceptible drift that takes us apart from others and God can be a slow kill.

The light and dark of our cultural world is an all-pervasive force and it wins hands down most of the time. Negotiating our way in the world is not easy. Some Christians want to create a protective enclave where worldly influences are excluded. Some engage in culture wars. Some try to walk carefully through the "minefield", discerning what might be in harmony with Christian values and what might be destructive of true humanity.

We can ask ourselves what choices do we need to make to strengthen our commitment to one another and to God. Making time for each other, for the family and for God can not only enable these relationships to survive but can also help them to flourish.

The daily cross of personal sacrifice for the good of the other unites us to the ultimate sacrifice of Jesus. In his sacrifice he showed that greatest love of laying down one's life for one's friends. Life is always growing and changing. If we cling on to one stage we ultimately lose both that and the greater life that was to come. We must die to our closed in lives in order to open out into the fuller, richer relationship. This is the unfolding path for singles entering partnership or marriage, for couples becoming parents, for families wanting to enter more fully into the local community, for people seeking a fuller life in God.

The simplest gestures and responses of generosity and compassion always bring us blessings. The prophet or the holy person may not be warmly welcomed by those challenged by their words or life-style. But those who already have some openness to truth and compassion can respond with kindness. (DMA)
