POPE FRANCIS ON HAPPINESS

"You can have flaws, be anxious and even be angry, but just remember that your life is the world's biggest contest." Only you can stop it from failing. You are appreciated, admired, and loved by so many. Remember that happiness is not having a sky without storms, a road without accidents, a job without effort, a relationship without disappointments.

"Being happy means finding strength in forgiveness, hope in battles, security in fear, love in discord." It's not only to enjoy the smile, but also to reflect on the sadness. It's not just about celebrating success it's about learning from failure It's not just about feeling happy with applause, it's about being happy anonymously. Being happy is not a fatality of destiny, but an achievement for those who can travel on their own.

"Being happy is to stop feeling victimized and become the author of your own destiny." "It is to walk through deserts, but to be able to find an oasis deep in one's soul. It's thanking God every morning for the miracle of life. To be happy is not to be afraid of your feelings and to be able to talk about yourself. Have the courage to hear a "no" and trust the criticism, even when it's unwarranted. It's about hugging your kids, hugging your parents, spending poetic moments with your friends, even when they hurt us.

"To be happy is to let the creature that lives in us live, free, joyful and simple." You are mature enough to say, "I made mistakes". Having the courage to say I'm sorry. It's the sense of saying "I need you". It's having the ability to say, "I love you". May your life become a garden of blissful opportunities that in spring is a lover of joy and in winter a lover of wisdom.

"And when you make a mistake, start over." Because only then will you be in love with life. You will find out that being happy isn't about having a perfect life. But use tears to irrigate the tolerance. Use your defeats to train your patience.

"Use your mistakes with serenity of the sculptor." Use the pain to connect to pleasure. Use obstacles to open the windows of intelligence. Never give up... Above all, never abandon the people who love you. Never stop being happy because life is an amazing show. ". *(from a talk given by Pope Francis on or about 17th August 2023)*

MANDATORY SAFEGUARDING TRAINING - CALLING ALL THOSE WHO ARE CATECHISTS, EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS WHO TAKE COMMUNION TO THE SICK AND HOUSEBOUND, OR ALL THOSE WHO VISIT THE SICK AND HOUSEBOUND ON BEHALF OF THE PARISH: You need to do your Safeguarding Training. The training has to be completed every 2 years and is mandatory. A REMINDER FOR READERS, EM'S AND INFO FOR WELCOMERS: Sometimes on your way to Mass you can encounter unforeseen delays. This is very frustrating. You know you won't be able to contact anyone to let them know as their phones will be on silent in church. We understand that this situation can make you anxious. To help ease this anxiety, some time ago we decided that if a EM or Reader is not present 15mins before Mass the Welcomer on duty will ask another Reader or EM to stand in. This gives the Reader in particular a short while to prepare- to check the Missal is in the correct place, that the microphone is on & to enable them to prepare the Readings for the day.

Please note: If the original Reader or EM turns up near to the time Mass is starting and *after* the replacement has been asked, then the *original* Reader/EM will be asked to stand down and the replacement Reader/EM will continue to take your place. Please do not be offended by this. **ALSO, if in advance when you get your rota** you find you cannot fulfil your duty as a EM or Reader on a particular day **and you have asked someone to swap your duty with you** (which is different from the above scenario) it is important that when *they* arrive at Mass (15 mins before Mass starts) they let the Welcomers know straight away. This will prevent the Welcomers approaching someone else and asking them to stand in. Thank you.
