

Diocese to hold its first inter-religious dialogue conference

A team of expert speakers, some of whom are internationally recognised, is lined up for Portsmouth Diocese's first interreligious dialogue conference, to be held on November 4, 2023 at St. Bede's Church, Basingstoke, from 10am to 3.30pm

The theme of the conference echoes the teaching document Meeting God in Friend and Stranger. Anyone with an interest in the Catholic Church's teaching on inter-religious dialogue and its relationship with non-Christian faiths is invited to attend.

Monsignor Canon Vincent Harvey, said: "We re-established the inter-religious dialogue team two years We are now delighted to offer the Diocese's first conference on inter-religious dialogue and are blessed to have engaged ... inspirational speakers. We look forward to opening up ways of strengthening our relationship with communities of other faiths in the Diocese of Portsmouth."


So these many years later I asked google and google delivered.

MASS READINGS FOR THE 29th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 45:1,4-6

Thus says the Lord to his anointed, to Cyrus, whom he has taken by his right hand to subdue nations before him and strip the loins of kings, to force gateways before him that their gates be closed no more: 'It is for the sake of my servant Jacob, of Israel my chosen one, that I have called you by your name, conferring a title though you do not know me. I am the Lord, unrivalled; there is no other God besides me. Though you do not know me, I arm you that men may know from the rising to the setting of the sun that, apart from me, all is nothing.

Responsorial Psalm: 95(96):1,3-5,7-10 Give the Lord glory and power.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5

From Paul, Silvanus and Timothy, to the Church in Thessalonika which is in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ; wishing you grace and peace from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. We always mention you in our prayers and thank God for you all, and constantly remember before God our Father how you have shown your faith in action, worked for love and persevered through hope, in our Lord Jesus Christ. We know, brothers, that God loves you and that you have been chosen, because when we brought the Good News to you, it came to you not only as words, but as power and as the Holy Spirit and as utter conviction.

Gospel Acclimation: Alleluia, Alleluia! Your word is truth, O Lord: consecrate us in the truth. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 22:15-21

The Pharisees went away to work out between them how to trap Jesus in what he said. And they sent their disciples to him, together with the Herodians, to say, 'Master, we know that you are an honest man and teach the way of God in an honest way, and that you are not afraid of anyone, because a man's rank means nothing to you. Tell us your opinion, then. Is it permissible to pay taxes to Caesar or not?' But Jesus was aware of their malice and replied, 'You hypocrites! Why do you set this trap for me? Let me see the money you pay the tax with.' They handed him a denarius, and he said, 'Whose head is this? Whose name?' 'Caesar's' they replied. He then said to them, 'Very well, give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar – and to God what belongs to God.'

Communion Antiphon: See how the eyes of the lord are on those who fear him, on those who hope in his love that he may rescue them from death and feed them in time of famine.
