## EVERYONE HAS SOMETHING TO RECEIVE AND SOMETHING TO GIVE.

In our first reading today, the prophet Malachi is exposing the failures of the then "clergy". The power of clergy generally has been both a blessing and a curse. A blessing when leadership has been enabling, encouraging, empowering and nurturing (as St Paul writes: "like a mother looking after her children). A curse when it has been dictatorial, oppressive, ignorant, narrow-minded and blind to its own prejudices and ego needs. Some clergy imagine they have a God-given right to lord it over a community's life of faith and worship remaking it according to their own personal likes & dislikes, making others bear the burden of their theological ignorance, scruples and hang-ups. But people are no longer allowing that to happen. This one-sided way of being church is disappearing fast.

An earlier prophet, Jeremiah, had foretold a time when there will be "no need for a man to teach his neighbour" for "they will all know me from the least to the greatest" (Jer 31:34). Through the prophet Joel God declared that: "I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy. Your young will see visions, and your old will dream dreams" (Joel 2:28). What we are experiencing in the Church and in the world now is the liberation of the gifts of the Holy Spirit in women and men of faith. The Spirit is no longer being suppressed by the ego needs of a few exploiting the dependency of the many. It's been a long time coming. Finally, the oppressive grip of a patriarchal and self-serving elite is being loosened. This elite has only itself to blame for its loss of authority and credibility. For too long ordinary people were not given any confidence in their own, God given, inner authority (the Spirit, the Christ within) but instead made dependent upon external authority which presumed to do the thinking and deciding for them, too often to its own advantage.

In today's world people can explore and educate themselves. They can enter into dialogue and discussion and be open to many different points of view. As Jesus suggested, they are judging for themselves what is right (Lk. 12:57). They can share experiences and learn from one another. They can benefit from different spiritualities and ways of prayer. They can experience a new awe and wonder as they see the unitive visions of science and contemplative "knowing" converge. And people are discovering that the yeast/leaven of the Gospel is already out there. The Kingdom has been growing of its own accord way beyond the boundaries of denominations and faith traditions.

The Church will always exist, but its form will have to change to allow the Gospel to be fully received and expressed. There will always be authority, but it is the authority of the Christ shared with all the sisters and brothers. There will always be one Father in heaven to whom every little "god" must submit. There will always be one Spirit given to everyone to drink. There will always be one way, the way of loving, humble service. (DMA)

MARGARET BARNES RIP: (Words from her daughter, Fiona) Mum arrived in Lymington from Donegal in Ireland in 1951. She initially worked caring for the children of a vicar in Milford on Sea. She worked at a nursing home in Milford also. A few years later she started working as a bus conductress based in Lymington. At the time she was lodging in New Street. She made many friends in Lymington a lot of whom she was still in contact with. She met Charles Barnes and they were married in Our Lady of Mercy and Saint Joseph Catholic Church in 1960. Mum had various other jobs around bringing up her two daughters Fiona and Caroline. She worked as a dinner lady at the school here (having been volunteered for the job by Fiona). As the girls grew up Mum worked at Efford Experimental Station in the packing shed and stayed there until retirement. When Dad sadly passed away suddenly in 2006. Mum stayed in Lymington with Caroline until giving into Fiona's nagging that they should move closer to her in Dorset.
The move happened in September 2007. Mum continued to care for Caroline well into her 80s and gradually gave over the caring role to Fiona. During her time in Lymington Mum regularly attended the 6:30pm Mass on a Saturday. She made many friends in the back pews! Margaret's requiem Mass is on Wednesday at 12.30pm in OLMSJ, followed by burial at Highfield cemetery. May Margaret rest in peace and rise in glory. Amen
