## WE ARE A COMMUNITY OF COMMUNITIES - THIS WEEKEND OUR PARISHES CELEBRATE TOGETHER

St Paul reminds us that our physical bodies are whole units made up of different parts. All the parts are needed and all need to function properly if the our bodies are to remain healthy. The philosopher Ken Wilber states that hierarchical structures are just the way everything is ordered. Everything is related, everything is interdependent. Natural hierarchies are structures of enablement not restriction or domination. Human hierarchies can be either enabling or dominating and stifling. The Catholic Church is hierarchical in its essence. But it is called to be a structure that enables, frees and empowers its members. Too often, however, it becomes the opposite, stifling, restricting and disempowering.

There can be different "communities" in the same parish. Neighbouring parishes can be part of a larger organisational structure, e.g. Pastoral Areas or Deaneries. Altogether we belong to a diocese. The dioceses in England & Wales are loosely drawn together by the Conference of Catholic Bishops. There are national groupings and international links and ultimately, as Catholics, we recognise the Pope as the symbol and guardian of unity for the universal Catholic community.

All these layers of connection are or should be administered according to the principle of subsidiarity. This is a modern (Pope Pius XI, 1931) Catholic social teaching that the best institutions for responding to a particular social task are those that are most proximate to it. So our first duty and task is to nurture the communities in which we live and work. The family being the first and most obvious unit. We must invest in, contribute to and nurture our different communities at all levels in so far as we can.

The Diocesan 10 year plan envisages that the parishes of each pastoral area eventually become one parish. But, as far as possible, the process and the eventual outcome must never be at the expense of local communities. The one parish structure and its way of operating must seek to enable and empower its member communities.

Essential to this journey and process is the adoption of the synodal way of relating, discerning and deciding together. This works by respectful and open-minded listening to every member of the community and the mutual seeking in prayer for the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

There are three questions that need to be explored. Firstly, what kind of church do we long for? Secondly, what kind of church does God long for? Thirdly, what can we practically do now to build for the future. Let us try and address all three questions at once. The fruits of the Holy Spirit are a good place to start: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faith, gentleness and self-control. The effort we need to put in is to make communities more welcoming, more joyful, more loving and serene in our trust in God and in our action for compassionate justice. Things are changing and must change but let us not be fearful or anxious or miserable. As we personally grow older and have to make the necessary changes in our life-style we try, as best we can, to do so with grace and serenity. Each generation must make way for the next and more often than not what we hope cannot yet be seen. As Jesus said: "Many prophets and holy people longed to see what you see and never saw it." We must do what we can to usher in the new age of the Church as God would want it: a community where the love and compassion of God can be received and celebrated, where all are drawn together in peace. From Pope Francis' Message for Seventh World Day of the Poor 19th **November 2023** with the theme of *not turning away*. Pope Francis takes his inspiration from the elderly Tobit, who says to his son, ""Do not turn your face away from anyone who is poor" (Tobit 4:7).

Pope Francis tells us that, "Whenever we turn away from those who are poor, we turn away from Jesus himself, who is forever associated with the most vulnerable in society (Matthew 25: 31-46)". Pope Francis goes on to celebrate the next door neighbours: "Ordinary people who quietly make themselves poor among the poor. They do more than give alms: they listen, they engage, they try to understand and deal with difficult situations and their causes.

The focus of today is not fundraising, though fundraising is essential, but encounter, accompaniment and change. We can sometimes 'subcontract' our charity by giving money to an organisation in the knowledge that they will do good. They will no doubt do good, but that approach may leave our hearts untouched by the lived experience of poverty. We are called to go 'beyond fundraising' on a journey of accompaniment with people in poverty, being converted ourselves in the encounter.
