LET ME HUG IT BETTER. Perhaps as a parent, grandparent or spouse you have consoled your child or partner with a big hug. Or perhaps you were given a hug that made things better. Was the sadness soothed away? Was the anger and upset dispelled? Did the light and warmth of love make the darkness disappear? Were you able to get back to your normal self to recover a clear mind and a happier heart? Perhaps we can answer "yes" to all those questions. The alien cloud that had filled our soul was gently blown away.

I wonder if this experience can help us understand what Jesus was doing when he cast out devils. When we give way to fear, to anger, to hopelessness, to cynicism or to a greedy or lustful obsession that harmful energy possesses us. It may cause us to say or do things that we later regret. The loving kindness of others can help to free us from what is ultimately going to be destructive.

In Luke 8:2, Mary Magdalene (?) is referred to as someone Jesus cured of evil spirits and ailments and 'out of whom went seven devils'. This may refer to a life-style that was self-destructive in a number of ways. Her encounter with Jesus assured her of God's love and forgiveness. For this she showed lavish gratitude such that Jesus said her many sins must have been forgiven her or she would not have shown such great love. The one who is forgiven little, shows little love (Luke 7:47).

The French legal system recognises what we call "crimes of passion". One example, is when we become dangerously possessed by sudden anger which may lead to violence. We are still responsible for our actions but in such circumstances they are not pre-meditated.

In Matthew 12: 43-45 we have this parable:"When an evil spirit comes out of a man, it goes through arid places seeking rest and does not find it. Then it says, 'I will return to the house I left.' When it arrives, it finds the house unoccupied, swept clean and put in order. Then it goes and takes with it seven other spirits more wicked than itself, and they go in and live there. And the final condition of that man is worse than the first. This is how it will be with this wicked generation". The problem is the house may be cleaned up and tidy but it is EMPTY. In Shakespeare's plays concerning Henry V, the young prince is at first leading a dissolute life. Then he cleans up his act when he becomes king only to adopt a ruthless persona in place of the dissolute one. Morally speaking he ends up worse than he was before. The demons in the parable very clearly represent the harmful and egocentric energies that can possess us if we are not careful and open to God's help.

So when Jesus goes into the desert he confronts those destructive energies and consciously rejects them by the power of the Spirit. This is what we need to do in prayer, to identify the dangers, and with the help of God's Spirit, summon up the strength to reject them. So we shall be better prepared for the challenges that life throws at us. How else did the murdered advocate of freedom and justice, Alexei Navalny remain steadfast in his resolve when on the receiving end of such demonic persecution? (DMA)
