3rd Sunday of Lent: 'Take all this out of here and

stop turning my father's house into a market.' In today's Gospel Jesus "cleanses" the temple - he drives out the money changers and the merchants. St John has Jesus accusing them of turning



the temple into a "market" - St Matthew uses stronger language "a den of robbers." The Temple was the place where God dwelt on earth, and by introducing trade inside the Temple court (and often cheating people who came there) this sacred space had been profaned. St John then says that the true temple, the true dwelling place of God, is the body of Jesus himself. As members of His body, incorporated by the Holy Spirit, it is we ourselves who have become the New Temple - our own bodies are the house of God. The season of Lent, especially this week, calls on us to cast out from the temple everything that is unworthy of the house of God. Have we cluttered up the temple with a "marketplace" of trivial things, with TV, or social media, or idleness? Have we profaned it through grave sin? Our Fasting, Prayer, and Almsgiving this season helps us more clearly see where we have become cluttered or profaned. Jesus continually cleanses the temple He has made in us, not with a whip but with the gentle healing through penance, Confession etc. The days to come, perhaps, is the time to return to the sacrament of Confession and ask the Lord to clear out whatever needs clearing out, in order that He might fill us up with the graces and the joys of Easter.
