

Fourth Sunday of Lent Father Paul writes.....

The Gospel this Sunday is the second of the three great Lenten Gospels from St. John which describes the healing of a man who was born blind. As we listen, two different and opposing human experiences are revealed. Jesus is the light of the world and the invitation that life offers is that we move closer and closer to the light which he is. Our relationship with him will bring us out of the darkness of human experience into the life that God intends for each of us. A life which is about joy in all its fullness. As the story unfolds the man born blind, as well as being cured at the hands of Jesus, changes in his appreciation of



the significance of Jesus in his life. He begins knowing that the man who cured him was called Jesus. By the end of the narrative, in verse 41, the blind beggar has come to believe that Jesus is from God and has the power of God, as he says "Lord, I believe" and then worshipped him. The man born blind was able to see because his blindness was healed and was able to see through the eyes of faith that Jesus was the Christ and the Messiah.

If the blind man moved towards Jesus the light and experienced conversion, the Pharisees moved in the opposite direction. As they conversed with the man, they went from the light into deeper darkness so that they could say of Jesus "we know that this man (Jesus) is a sinner". It is worth noting, that they were resistant to any change that they considered Jesus was bringing. In fact, they were so resistant that they denied reality. The reality that only God could heal a person who had been blind from birth. Attentiveness to reality, avoidance of denial and complete trust in the goodness of God revealed in Jesus, is crucial to our growth in humanity and our growth in faith, which is a continual gift from God.

The invitation of today's Gospel about the blind man is to bring the darkness that invades our lives to Christ who is the light. St. Paul puts it well "You were darkness once, but now you are light in the Lord; be like children of the light, for the effects of the light are seen in complete goodness and right living and truth."

The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available at the normal times and in Fordingbridge on Saturday 16th March between 11.00am and 12.00 noon and in Ringwood on Saturday 23rd March between 11.00am and 12 noon. There will be adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on both occasions. Canon Peter Wilkie is also available for the Sacrament of Reconciliation at Allenbrook Care Home at 34, Station Road, Fordingbridge. He is available during daylight hours.

Readings at Mass on the 3rd, 4th and 5th Sunday of Lent: We will use Cycle A readings on these Sundays. That is a special provision for those parishes who have candidates for reception. The Gospels speak of that conversion which is growth into a relationship with Jesus.

I have decided to re-instate the external bell at Fordingbridge. I would welcome contributions to the expense and donations can be made on the DONA machine in the porch.


