This Sunday is the Third Sunday of Easter Today's Gospel (Lk 24:35-38) comes right after Jesus' encounter with the two disciples on their way to Emmaus. In the opening verse the two disciples have just shared their story about meeting Jesus on the road and how Jesus made Himself known to them in the breaking of the bread. After the two disciples vented their disappointment and expressed their shattered hopes and expectations, Jesus asked them: "Did not the Messiah have to suffer these things and then enter His glory?" And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, He explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning Himself. And after they recognized Jesus in the breaking of the bread, the two disciples asked each other: "Were not our hearts burning within us while He talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?" Now in today's Gospel these same two disciples are sharing their experience, when Jesus suddenly appears. After showing them the marks of the nails in His hands and feet and after eating a piece of fish to show that it really was Him and He was indeed risen and alive, He does what He did for the two disciples of Emmaus. He opens their minds to understand the Scriptures: "This is what I told you while I was still with you: everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms."

During our pilgrimage there will be moments of quiet reflection and peace, as well as times when we will be able to hear the chanting and singing of hundreds of voices.
