May our lives be always centred on our Lord in the Eucharist, and may we be devoted sons and daughters of Mary, our Mother, in making You known and loved.

Holy Mary, Model of Vocations, teach us to hear and follow Your Son. Holy Mary, Queen of Priests, sanctify our priests and obtain for us many more. Holy Mary, Mother of the Church, pray for our families and intercede for our children. Amen.

As well as praying for vocations, we also have to pay to train the next generation of clergy. There will be a Second Collection this Sunday for the Clergy Training Fund, which supports our seminarians through their seven

-year training for the priesthood, including the 12 men currently in training, for the duration of their six- or seven -year journey to ordination. Each seminarian brings to his training his own life experience, and then participates in a comprehensive programme of formation pastorally, intellectually, humanly and spiritually. These are the men who will baptize and catechize the coming generations, and care for us on our pilgrim way: our generosity today is a legacy to the Church of tomorrow. To sustain a seminarian costs around £30,000 each year.
